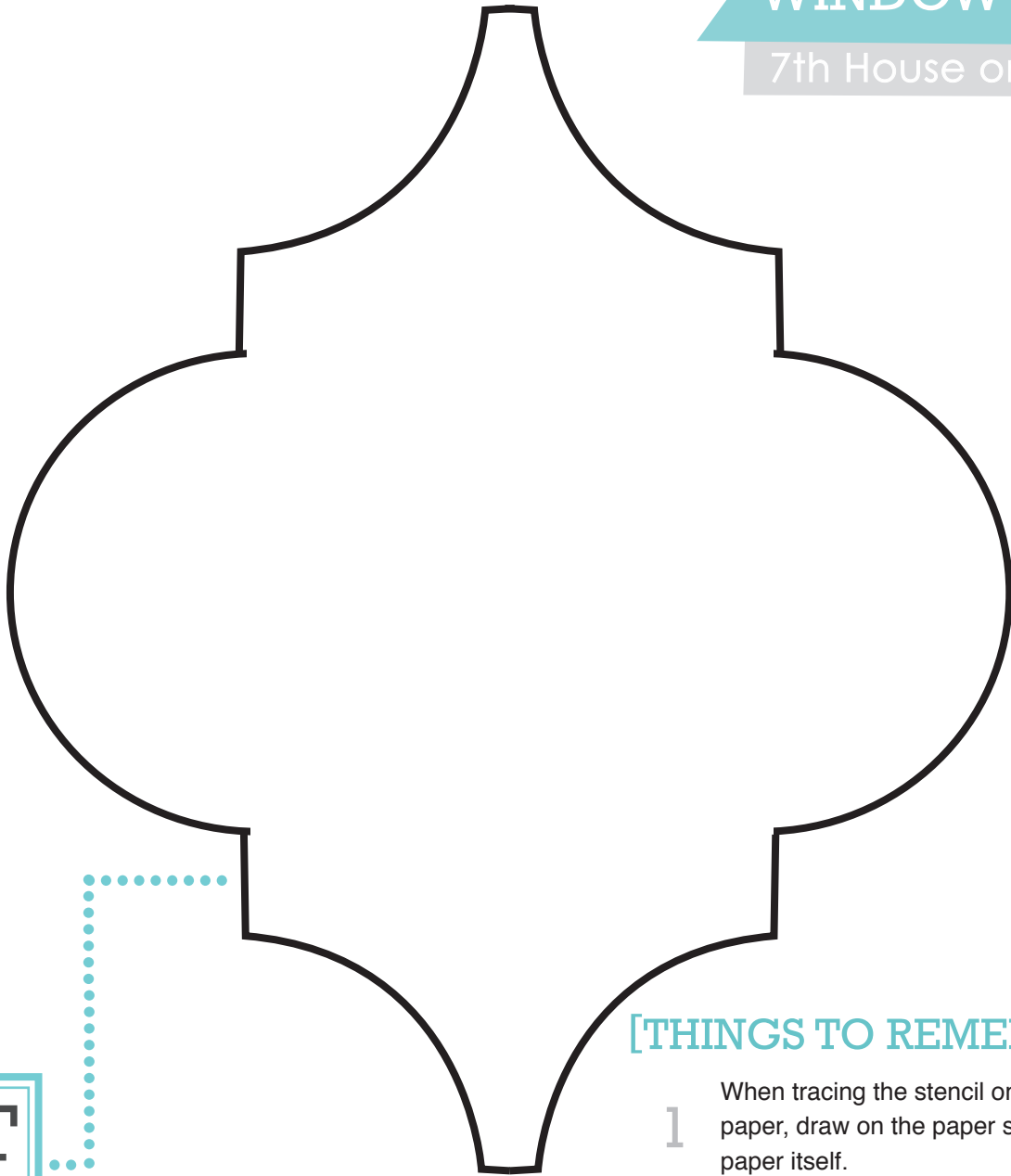


WINDOW STENCIL

7th House on the Left



**CUT
ME**

[WHAT YOU NEED]

a clean window
contact paper
scissors
this stencil
utility knife (or razor)
fine marker
a few good movies

[THINGS TO REMEMBER]

- 1 When tracing the stencil onto the contact paper, draw on the paper side, not contact paper itself.
- 2 Keep the scissors moving. This will give you a much cleaner line.
- 3 Clean the window VERY well before you start. After you finish applying each row, wipe off any finger prints you left on the window with a dry cloth before you start on the next row.
- 4 When peeling the contact paper backing, do it slowly. If the contact paper creases or wrinkles, it will show up on the window, no matter how much you try to smooth it out.
- 5 If you have a bubble, don't try to rub it out too hard. That always ended up with a crease so I had to do it over. Rubbing out the bubble lightly and slowly works much better.
